

SIXTIES SCOOP SETTLEMENT

Who is eligible?

The settlement includes people who:

- were removed from their homes in Canada between January 1, 1951 and December 31, 1991 and placed in the care of non-Indigenous foster or adoptive parents; and
- are registered Indians and Inuit as well as people eligible to be registered Indians.

Estates of eligible individuals who passed away after Feb. 20, 2009 may also apply.

What do I need to do?

Complete a Claim Form and send it to the Claims Administrator by **August 30, 2019**. A copy of the Claim Form is available at sixtiesscoopsettlement.info.

You do not need to pay a lawyer to complete the form. The administrator will help you fill out the form and there are lawyers you can speak with free of charge.

What if I don't have all the info?

If you do not have papers from the relevant provincial or territorial child service agency documenting your placement in care or documenting your status, you should still complete the Claim Form. The administrator will make the necessary record checks for you, as needed.

How much money will I get?

Your payment will depend on how many Eligible Class Members submit claims in the settlement. The range of compensation will likely be \$25,000 - \$50,000.
