Opportunities:

Work as an Archaeological Field Liaison for the Chippewas of the Thames First Nation (COTTFN). Once you complete the training, you be scheduled to attend an interview for the Archaeology Feild Liaison Program.

The requirements for the position are:

- Must be a COTTFN Band member,
- Able to get to and from the job site (Anywhere within Southwestern Ontario)
- Physically able, with or without accommodation, to extensively perform bending, kneeling, standing, lifting and carrying objects weighing up to 50 lbs.
- Must have a tolerance for working in outdoor environments, prolonged walking and standing on various terrain in a wide range of weather conditions.
